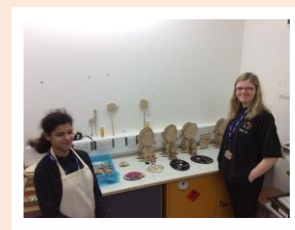
Thank you to all of the parents and carers who have expressed an interest in the role of Parent Governor. We will be in touch soon with more details of the next stage of the election process.

Despite having to make the difficult transition from the school to work environment and adjusting to the fact that others are depending upon them, the students are now part of the team working for the Service Users of the Sandwell Leisure Trust! All the staff at the Portway are very welcoming and supportive of our students. I feel very privileged to be involved in this exciting initiative. It is a brilliant opportunity for our students to be supported as they gain essential skills in order to succeed in the work environment. '

One student had the following to say about their experiences of supported internship so far:

'Before I started here I felt very anxious, but everyone is friendly at Portway. I still sometimes feel anxious in the morning, but once I get started I am OK. It is different from school here; I am more like an adult, I use first names for staff and I have got a swipe card to get in through the doors. I have done lots of cleaning. I like helping in sports best. I have helped with football, cricket and archery. After my internship I would like a job here at Portway, but with no cleaning! I might stay at school and get some more qualifications, I am not sure. I am at school 2 days a week. I am working on travel training, BTEC Vocational Studies, and English and maths.'

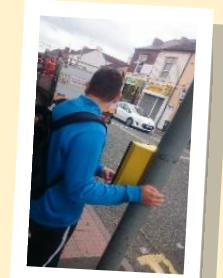

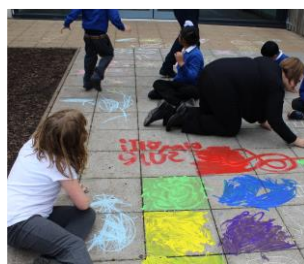


Learning about Diwali

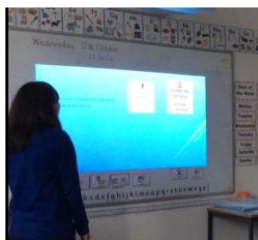

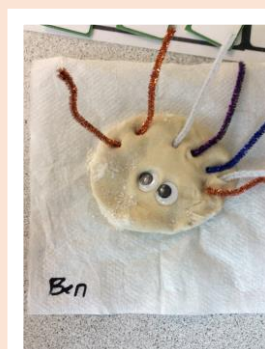
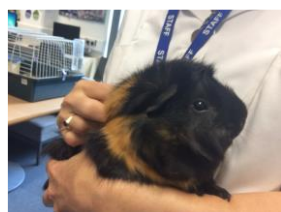
Roald Dahl Day

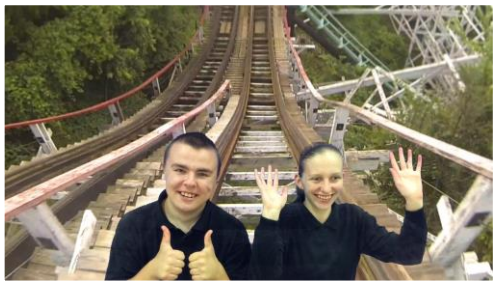

CLOWN PRANKS - A MESSAGE FROM WEST MIDLANDS POLICE

In recent days West Midlands Police has received reports of 'pranks' involving people dressed as clowns jumping out of bushes to scare passing school children.

We do not believe there is any physical risk to members of the public but we are taking these incidents seriously because they are causing considerable upset to families and children.

We remind all young people and their parents that it is a criminal offence to use threatening, abusive or insulting words or behaviour or disorderly behaviour to intentionally cause a person harassment, alarm or distress. It is an offence punishable by up to six months imprisonment and/or a fine.

We encourage both parents and schools to discuss with their children and students the impact such 'pranks' have on other people and the serious consequences of a criminal conviction on their future careers.
